For this week's discussion, let's address revision and time management. One of the challenges in being in an online course is that you have to do a lot of revision work on your own, so in your response, consider the following:

- Are you leaning on anyone to help you with your revisions?
- What challenges have you faced with revising your own texts?
- What advice would you give to a student considering taking an online writing course?

For this week's discussion, let's discuss "credible sources".

- What have you been told about finding credible sources for your research?
- Where do you usually look to find credible sources?
- Who do you consider as a credible author?

Let's reflect on technology in our lives for this week's discussion. We've talked a lot this term about reading, writing and technology, so in your response, consider the following:

- Has your view of "traditional college writing" changed because of technology?
- Have your own personal writing strategies for writing changed because of technology?
- Do you find yourself noticing more of the things you're reading and how they're being delivered, print/online? Feel free to pull any of the readings into your discussion.

After reading more about working with visual texts in your textbook this week, consider the follow questions for this week's discussion:

 How does our reading of visual images differ from our reading of print-based texts?

- What are some of the differences between the layout/structure of visual texts verses the layout/structure of print-based texts?
- What did you learn about visual texts after reading the information on one of the links below?
- What is your experience with visual texts?
