

Using Labor-Based Grading Contracts in OWI

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To Remember:

Don't let your LMS dictate how you grade your students.

If you want to implement labor-based contracting grading in your online course, use student-centered design (user research, iterative design, and collaboration) to create contract documents that will increase student comprehension.

Applying the student-centered design process to the contract document itself:

- Start with what you know about your students' needs when it comes to assessment documents and online reading
- Chunk information to make it readable and increase engagement
- Check in with students to ensure they understand the grading contract and can ask questions
- Ask students how to improve grading contract materials and your communication
