These strategies are useful for both tutoring and instructing student writers.

- **Practical to implement:** You can start using these strategies today with your students, and the strategies require no additional technology or tools.
- Aid comprehension: These strategies help students navigate, understand, and use your writing feedback, which is often helpful for students unused to writing feedback or the kind of writing feedback you may be giving.
- **Encourage active revision:** These strategies involve students in the revision process, asking them to engage in their writing proactively rather than passively consuming your feedback.
